- 6. Youth Outreach Update
 - a. Bill did not attend the meeting awaiting update on Cub Scouts/Brownies and more
 - b. CRC Westwood, disc donation and more
 - b.i. Eddie Mack has worked with Steph Mack to provide CUPA a solid connection to Cincinnati Recreation Commission (CRC) in getting ultimate on the menu for more youth in Cincy. Right now, ultimate has a pretty good presence in private schools but not nearly enough outside of this market
 - b.ii. CUPA provided 21 discs (175g) and 10 youth discs (145g), along with numerous rule books and instructional DVDs to the CRC's Westwood Town Hall Rec Center (just one center of 25 that make up CRC) for their summer ultimate camp/class. In the past, they only had 3 discs that were 5 years old. The donation helped at least 40 youth (30 from the summer day camp and 10 from the local neighborhood; ages 8-18) on every Tuesday and Thursday from June 7 August 4, 2011. It was the first time the CRC leaders could teach the youth the techniques of ultimate with the equipment and knowledge since both Andrea McCarthy (CRC Community Center Director) and Meredith Effler (Westwood CRC) attended the Women's Clinic in the spring
 - b.iii. Overall, the CRC program is part of the summer class program the city and CRC offer to any family who signs up for a \$10/year membership. Getting ultimate on the menu and more and more kids playing causes ultimate in Cincy to grow
 - b.iv. The Westwood CRC also took information regarding the Spirit of the Game and made it into an award for campers and drop-ins who displayed outstanding spirit and sportsmanship in ultimate

Frisbee; and also made each attendee sign a spirit contract, pledging good sportsmanship, in everything they do, not just ultimate

b.v. Going forward, CUPA would like to partner more with additional CRCs and Eddie and Steph are reaching out towards Andrea and Meredith to learn interest from other CRCs as well as confirmation that they will be attending the spring clinic again – most likely will with at least 8 others

- a. Liz K. informed everyone that we need to have better communication overall with the board
 - a.i. Assigning committees should be priority #1
 - a.ii. Turn in any receipts as soon as possible
 - a.iii. Take surveys when provided so we can gain feedback for future leagues
